Hampton Plantation State Historic Site

4 Alston Chimney



The chimney is all that remains of the African-American tenant farmers at Hampton Plantation. Once part of a home built by Prince and Sue Alston, it now stands as a testament to the lives of the Alston family and the African-Americans living at Hampton after the end of slavery.

5 Nature Trail



The nature trail consists of a 2.5 mile hike around an abandoned rice field that is slowly reverting back to a cypress swamp. You will also be able to enjoy some of South Carolina's wildlife.

8 The Kitchen House



The kitchen house was built in the mid to late 1800s and served as the plantation kitchen until the 1930s. We believe this building is the third kitchen to be built on this site, and is one of the only visible remnants of the enslaved African-Americans who called Hampton home.

9 The Mansion



Built between 1730 and 1750, this Georgian-styled mansion stands as a testament to the wealth of the Horry/Pinckney/Rutledge family, the African-Americans who were enslaved here, and the importance of rice and indigo to colonial South Carolina's economy.

10 Hampton Island

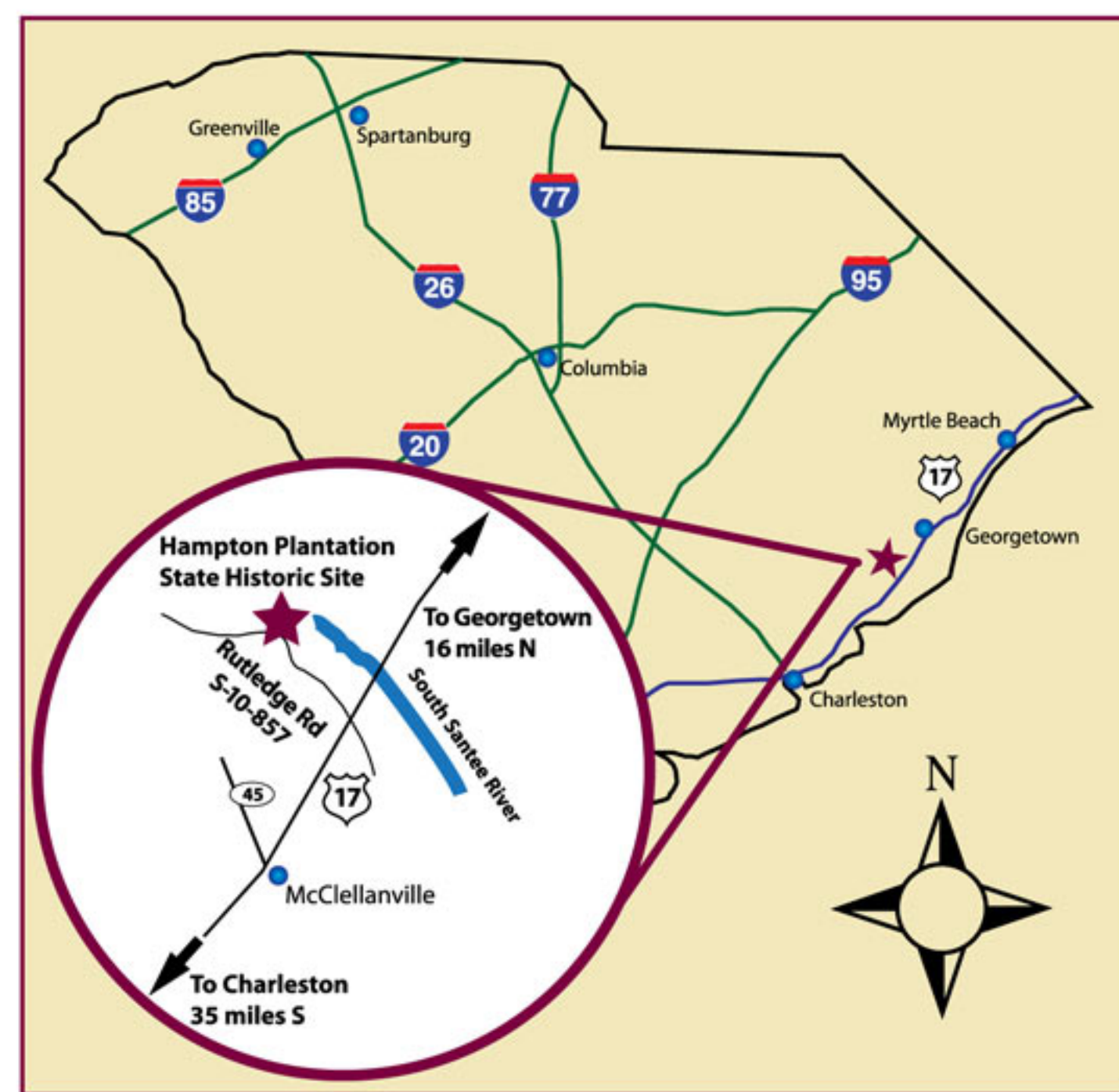


Hampton Island was once a thriving 350 acre rice island located between Wambaw Creek and South Santee River. Today it serves as an important agricultural link to the enslaved people as the hand dug canals are still visible.

17 Sam Hill Cemetery



Sam Hill is one of the sites where the enslaved people were buried at Hampton. Today it is an active burial site as the descendants of those who were enslaved at Hampton are still being buried there.

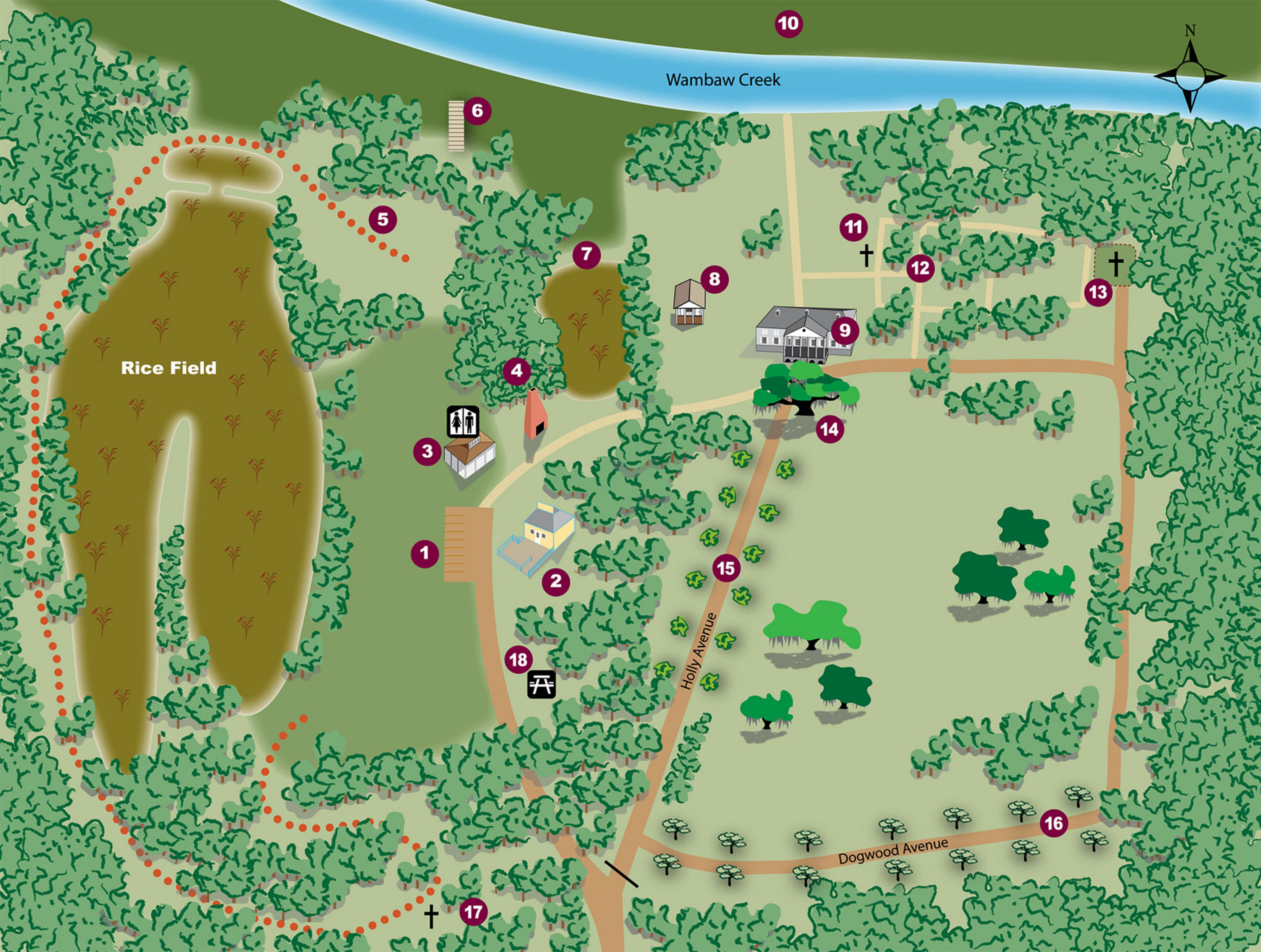
